We are conscious that the club is made up of you the members and as a committee we can only administer and develop the club with your consent and full support. We appreciate the support and trust given to us.





We have tried to keep the maps as simple as possible. With this in mind each map shows the water located on an ordinance survey map or similar.



Belmont Estate



General Information - The Belmont Estate consists of a series of pools, all of which are mainly carp fisheries. The main water on the complex is **Belmont Pool** which is just over an acre in size and contains specimen, pristine carp from VS Fisheries. This is a low stocked water to appeal to the discerning carp angler. This is a balloted water as is Serpentine Pool.

Serpentine Pool contains a good head of carp with plenty of mid-doubles along with a few twenties. It also received a stocking of fast-growing VS Fisheries Carp in late 2020.

Willow Pool is more of a pleasure fishing water. Tench, roach, bream, perch, and a good stocking of carp from a few pounds to low double figures provide excellent waggler and pole fishing, especially during the summer months.

Rowan Pool is the smallest pool on the complex and had a healthy stock of small carp from 3 to 6lb in weight, ideal for getting younger children into the sport

Yew Tree has carp between 8 and 11lb and a few VS carp were also added, with the average weight being 9lb, ideally a feeder tactic water, but make sure your elastic is heavier if tackling this pool with pole tactics as its bound to get stretched!

Oak Pool currently contains carp to mid-doubles, roach, and perch.

Please Note: You must pre-book pegs on Belmont Pool and Serpentine Pool. Specific rules apply to these waters that are strictly enforced. Please ensure you familiarise yourself with these rules prior to fishing.

Heading west along the M56, leave at junction 10 and take the A559 sign posted Northwich. Continue for approximately 5 miles until you reach Sevenoaks Saddlers on the right-hand side. Immediately opposite is a left turn into Pole Lane, turn left at this point but rather than turn into Pole Lane, turn onto the driveway next to a flat-topped sandstone lodge. Belmont Moat and Friars Pool



General Information

Two former stew ponds situated on the northeast side of the Belmont Estate make these waters quite historic. In addition to ancient wild carp, these waters contain roach, bream, crucians, tench, and unique hybrids.

It should be noted that these waters are currently under development by the Property Owner.

Heading west along the M56, exit at junction 10. Take the A559 sign posted Northwich. Continue for approximately five and a half miles until you reach Cransley Girls School on the left-hand side. Take the next left and after half a mile turn left. Continue for just over 300m where you may park on the grass verge just before a field gate next to the first house on the left.

Bridgewater Canal



General Information

This stretch of the Bridgewater Canal is just over 4 miles in length, running through Runcorn from Waterloo Bridge through to Preston Brook Marina. It is regarded by many as one of the most prolific canal stretches for specimen-sized fish in the Northwest of England. The length has any excellent pedigree, having produced carp over 30lbs, pike to well over 20lbs, bream over 8lbs, tench over 8lbs and perch over 3lbs, all backed by a good supply of roach over the magical 2lb mark. Fishing to features, such as moored boats, bridges or lily pads is the key to locating the fish here and it is very much worthwhile putting up with the boat traffic during the summer months as the disturbance caused rarely has any impact on feeding fish. Specimen hunters can roam along the length to hunt their quarry whilst pleasure and match anglers can build up swims slowly to attract the shoals of big roach and bream.

As this stretch runs through urban Runcorn there are plenty of parking areas available. Members are advised to locate these for themselves, ensuring they do not obstruct access to the vehicles of local residents or commercial premises. Fishing from towpath only, night fishing allowed but keep tow path clear.

Directions

For **Waterloo Bridge** head west along the M56 and come off at Junction 12, heading towards Runcorn. At the roundabout take the 2nd exit and travel for 4.8 miles before turning left onto Leiria Way. After 0.3 mile turn left onto High Street. A free car park is located off this road on the right just before the road bridge. The canal and its pathway are adjacent. East (left as you approach on foot) leads to Preston Brook. For **Preston Brook Marina**, head west along the M56 and come off at Junction 11, heading towards Preston Brook/Daresbury. At the roundabout, take the 1st exit. Take the 2nd exit at each of the next two roundabouts and after about a mile turn left onto Marina Lane.

Catch Penny Pool



General Information

Catch Penny Pool is a disused sand working, about 19 acres, virtually circular, lying between Chelford and Holmes Chapel. It has been established as a fishery for some years with a recent stocking of 300 carp this former syndicate water has much to offer. The south bank is grassy and free of any obstruction, suitable for older members. The north bank and west side are heavily planted with trees and bushes and rather steep, so access is tricky in parts, there is also a small landing stage at the north end. The pool is flat bottomed, about 30ft deep all over, with a shelf of shallows, narrow in parts which fall off quickly into deep water. Special rules apply to this water and members are advised to thoroughly read the water specific rules.

Directions

Head west on M56 at junction 11, take the A56 exit to Preston Brook/Daresbury at the roundabout, take the 5th exit onto the M56 slip road to Manchester/M6, merge onto M56. At junction 9, use the left 2 lanes to merge onto M6 towards Birmingham at junction 19, take the A556 exit to Northwich/Macclesfield/Knutsford. Take A537 and A535 to Catchpenny Lane at Tabley Interchange, take the 3rd exit onto Chester Rd/A556, turn left onto Northwich Rd/A5033, at the roundabout, take the 3rd exit onto King Edward Rd/A50, continue to follow A50 after 0.3 mile turn left onto Adams Hill/A537. Continue to follow A537 for 5.0 miles, at the roundabout, take the 3rd exit onto Holmes Chapel Rd/A535. Continue to follow A535 for 2.4 miles, turn left onto Catchpenny Lane, destination will be on the right.





Founders Pool



General Information

Founders pool is a noted carp and cat fishery, just over an acre in size. In addition to its stock of carp which run to the mid-twenties the water also contains some cracking roach and bream along with perch, crucians and rudd. Catfish are present in good numbers these range in size from a few ounces to 30lb+.

Lymmvale & Lymmvale Stock Pond



General Information

Lymmvale is a former sand quarry of around 6½ acres. It is one of the most beautiful and enigmatic specimen waters anywhere in the country. The water holds the British golden orfe record but unfortunately these pretty fish have vanished in recent years. Specimen tench, carp, and cats along with good sized bream and big eels are on offer here, with the tench fishing in particular providing some of the finest sport in the Northwest. Hauls of 30 tench in a session are possible and fish to over the magical 10lb mark provide targets for the dedicated specimen hunter.

The water also holds a particularly good head of beautifully marked carp with the ghosties being the most attractive. Many of these fish are now over 20lb and a few have reached 30lb. Catfish to over 80lb round off the excellent range of specimens that hide in the depths of Lymmvale. Lymmvale's stock pond contains numerous small tench, carp, roach and rudd and is an excellent float water.



Micklewrights Flash is SSSI water, a mixed fishery and former day-ticket venue offering superb fishing. Recent fishing has produced double figure catches of carp up to 19lb and beyond. Tench have been caught in excess of 5lb, bream and roach fishing are also to be had. The water has a head of pike and fish up to 16lb have been caught as well as perch to 2lb.

Sparrow Grove & Tetton Flash



General Information

At present there is only parking for 8 cars. To facilitate this please park diagonally nose to the water. From time-to-time members of the public will be parked in the parking area, although they only generally stay for a short period of time. They have the right to do so and neither Lymm AC or the Landlord have control over this, and members **MUST NOT** park anywhere else other than the designated area. **Under no circumstances should members venture or cast into Middlewich AC land or water at the north end of our fishing.**

Sparrow Grove is a 2-acre lake with a section of the bankside deemed a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI). This lake is a mixed fishery with specimen Carp, Tench, Bream, Roach, and Perch. The lake bottom is mainly clay with a small number of weeds; depths range from approximately 1.6 to 2.5 metres. Fishing is allowed from the stages located down the left-hand side of the lake only.

Tetton Flash this lake was formed by subsidence caused by the extraction of salt brine many years ago. The club has approximately 3 acres of the lake on the south side, which is adjacent to and can be accessed from Sparrow Grove.

Head south-east on M6 at junction 18, take the A54 exit to Chester/Northwich/Middlewich. At the roundabout, take the 3rd exit onto Holmes Chapel Rd/A54. 

Due to the waters size, location can be problematic, however devotees are well rewarded. **Note;** No bankside access is allowed on Tabley Mere and members must book the club punt to fish the mere, bookings can be made by emailing bookings@lymmanglersclub.com, a sufficient buoyancy aid must be worn at all times. The Tabley estate including Tabley Mere, and Tabley Moat is closed to all members from 15th March until 31st May please do not jeopardise the club's agreement by breaking this rule.

Heading south on the M6, take junction 19 (Knutsford). Turn right onto the A556 towards Chester. At the first set of traffic lights, turn left on to Northwich Rd heading towards Knutsford, Macclesfield A5033. 

Wrinehill Pool

Carp to 30lb plus are present, as are tench in excess of 7lb and perch over 3lb. Large bream and 40lb+ catfish add to the appeal. Ample, secure on-site parking is provided and a well-maintained path around the perimeter of the water provides easy access for those staying overnight.

General Description

The water is generally 5 feet deep and 50 ft wide. It is well stocked (by us) with Bream, Roach, Perch some Tench, and Pike. All road bridges provide access to the canal bank, but parking can vary from area to area. The most successful methods are pole using bread, maggot, or worm baits.

Bream run to 3lb generally Roach to 1lb and Perch to 2lb Tench are not as prolific as they were years ago but when you do catch them, they tend to be 3-4 lb. However this year we embarked on a stocking program for tench, so we hope for a big improvement. Pike are prolific and as well as a lot of small ones double figure fish are not unusual.

There are no locks on the whole of the length until the city centre and as a result, flow is very limited with no more than a very steady tow towards Liverpool. There are large, weeded areas mostly from Maghull through to Liverpool and in summer it can cover the whole of the canal.
